





A flourishing innovation neighborhood focused on driving economic growth, but also committed to creating a lifestyle focused on wellness, culture and giving back. We have regular programming, designed to encourage the exchange of ideas through leisure—yoga in the park, family-friendly outdoor cinema, running groups, concerts and fundraisers.

In the heart of our neighborhood, you'll find Bailey Park, 1.6 acres of publicly accessible green space with a stage and a food truck court, making it a favorite lunchtime spot for students, workers and loft residents who gravitate to the green space with their dogs or their culinary cravings. If you bike, walk or run, find solace on Long Branch Trail, a 1.7-mile urban greenway, which connects to the city's larger trail system to create a 20-mile loop.




